In returning, from riding, have found the Lord Chancellor's
letter accompanied by a Commission for passing the Bills now
ready for my Assent. He may rely on my feeling the weight
of much of his reasoning on the future Establishment for
the Prince of Wales; but at the same time Mr. Pitt having
in my name assured Mr. Fox that the proposition should
be stated to Parliament and every effort used to carry it
into effect, I do not feel myself at liberty to ~~give~~ ^{relieve}
~~the King on this occasion~~ but ^{see no objection} ~~to~~ ^{submit} the Lord
Chancellor's stating his opinion on paper to the Prince
of Wales, and if he thinks it will have more effect by
being further explained by Mr. Anstouther he certainly
may send him either this evening or tomorrow morning
to see what he thinks; but it is improper for me having given
my approbation to the Prince of Wales to take any part
in this transaction
