I have read over Mr Pitt's letter with Attention as well as
his probable state of the Division on the Question of the
future Establishment for the Prince of Wales, and have
no doubt but Mr Pitt has drawn it up with as much
accuracy as the nature of a Division will admit; it is
certainly ^{as far as the success} unfavourable of the proposition; but in the
situation Mr Pitt has placed me by committing my
Approval to the Prince of Wales I cannot honourably
outstep; but I have no objection to Mr Pitt's again
stating ^{his difficulties} ^{again} it in writing to the Prince of Wales; I believe
the Lord Chancellor will do it also, and if Mr Pitt
will send Mr. Rastrel to explain the State to
the Prince at Lempshot perhaps some mode
may be found of settling his unpleasant business
but I cannot take any part till my son has said
his line without an apparent breach of promise
which no difficulties ought to make a Man consent
to
