I think it right to acquaint Mr. Pitt that the Prince of Wales
has come here in consequence of the Conversation he has had
with Lord Cholmondeley, and has on the whole judged it best to
relinquish any Promise of supporting the full extent of the
Establishment for him as proposed by Mr. Pitt. This will be
fully explained to Mr. Pitt by that Lord who is going for that
purpose to Town, the Prince and with my thorough approbation
will not come in to any plan of putting the duty of
Annual out of his hands, and seems most unwilling that
any public stipulation shall be made out of his Income
for the Prince of Wales, ^{that never having heard as yet the custom} ~~but for some reason or other will have~~
~~the same Annual Allowance as my Mother had from~~
~~my Father, which with the Expense of his Household~~
~~is stated at less than 10,000. per Annum.~~ My son very
reasonably states that should a more favorable moment
appear, he trusts he shall have my countenance towards
obtaining the Addition to his Income ^{which was first}
proposed, this request I could not but wish very great.
