Lord North, Had it not stood in your letter of this day that you should be ready to come at any time agreeable which I understood was a desire of its being at an early period I should not have thought of fixing this evening. I desire you will not on account of what I wrote to come an hour sooner to Town than you would otherwise do. I have put the notes and cash of my late Mother together so that if you wish it to be delivered to Mr. Martin immediately I can send it to Mr. Robinson on hearing from you with a list of them.

As I reside in the Housekeeper's Chamber House I will take care that every thing shall be attended to there till I see you next when I will give my final directions.

The giving the Furniture of the Coffee Room to Mr. Quill and the Kitchen Furniture to the Cook is very proper. I think I have here answered all the Memorandums. I return to you the Charts which you sent this Morning
