you that Mr Gordon is this morning

of the capture of the Isle of France, with
a considerable loss on the second Dec^r
last. Lord Liverpool begs to be
permitted to add that after the severe
losses of the East India Company in the
course of the present War from the destruction
of the merchant ships of the Enemy's
ships of War, the capture of this Island
must be considered as an object of
great vital importance to the
interests of His Majesty, and of the
Company

Company, that unless he occurs ^{from} your
Royal Highness orders to the contrary,
he will take the duty of giving
Directions that the Mark of your Highness
should be put on the occasion
