In consequence of the death of General Ormsby  
two years back, I felt it my duty as His  
Executor on behalf of his family to make  
my exertion to have his Commission as  
Lieut Colonel the 6<sup>th</sup> Dragoon Guards sold  
but without effect, it still remains vacant  
and I am not without hopes that something  
may now be done,

General Ormsby who was Honored with a  
very flattering share of the esteem of His  
Royal Highness the Prince, it may be  
recollected at His Royal Highness's desire  
signed his resignation of his Commission  
but his death which followed shortly  
after with other circumstances suspended that



remuneration to his family that they were so  
very justly entitled to, the General having  
purchased all his commissions and had  
served His Majesty upwards of fifty years,  
my object in troubling you with this address  
is to request you will assist me (as the  
old friend of the General) as to the mode  
of bringing the claim of the family before  
His Royal Highness the Prince Regent  
in the most respectful manner, if you  
shall deem what I have stated calculated  
to answer that end, I shall feel much obliged  
by your submitting the subject to His  
Royal Highness consideration, and may I  
beg of you to favour me with the result.
