that your Royal Highness may be assured that they are not to be granted upon any political or party consideration, but really on grounds of Charity towards the parties whose Cases so strongly require the relief which will be afforded by these Pennies.

Mr Brevint humbly requests your Royal Highness will be graciously ^{pleas'd} to direct the return of the List, if it should be approved, that he may direct the warrants to be prepared accordingly.

Mr Brevint ought to add that these Pennies will so nearly exhaust the Sum granted by Parliament for the grant of Pennies under the last Act, as to leave only about 900 which can at present be granted - and this Sum Mr Brevint conceives your Royal Highness will be of opinion is not more than should

be kept in reserve, not only for accidental Cases which may occur of a similar description, but also with a view to several very hard Cases of the distressed relatives of deceased Military officers, which are at present before Mr Brevint but which he has not at present brought under your Royal Highness's Consideration, because he hopes to be enabled to obtain, thro' the Parliamentary grant of this year under the Army Estimates some increased means of providing for them, but should his hopes fail him in that respect, he will be obliged to recur back to the last Act for their relief.

Mr Brevint also forwards the appointment of Mr Bond to the Astronomer Royal for your Royal Highness's signature, according to your Pleasure expressed to Mr Brevint on this
