Lord Liverpool has the Honour
to transmit to your Royal Highness
an Abstract of the Dispatch of Sir William
Beresford, on the occasion of the Battle
of Albuera, together with a List of the
Officers killed and Wounded.

copied, and Lord Liverpool will
have the Honour of waiting upon
your Royal Highness any day this
night or tomorrow morning if you may
be pleased to appoint, with some
private letters from Lord Wellington,
which are very interesting.

As your Royal Highness was absent
from Town, and I myself has taken
the liberty of consulting His Royal
Highness the Duke of York on the
prospects of giving the guns upon
this occasion, and His Royal Highness
has expressed His Comention that if
your Royal Highness was in Town
you would decide both in Justice
to the Brave Army engaged, and for
the Importance of the Result of the
Action itself, that the guns ought
to be fired
