Will you my dear General, have the goodness
to lay before the ^{the} former Regent, ^{me} enclosed, this
Day or Tomorrow, — Although it is probable you
will see this immediately, yet I will anticipate
the contents — It is a copy of a proposition I have
made the Commanded in Chief to raise Directly
600 Hough Hussars, to do the Fatiguing Duties of
a Camp, such a Corps will save your best
Cavalry, and keep the whole of them always in
a State to come in contact with the Enemy;
and from what I can learn there is more
than a fourth of them hors de Combat in less than
a month after they have taken the Field, I leave
Town on Monday, I wish not to have the
mortification of not being at the Fete of Cartton
House, to which indeed I have no pretensions
to be invited, should my proposition be
Acceded to, you know my Address Crown
point Norfolk.
