Sir

I have had some doubts whether
to call ^{on} or to write to you on the Subject of
some Animadversions that have appeared in
the Times on the Subject of the Duke of York's
Appointment. The only Reason for my offering
any Explanation to you is - That having on a
former occasion solicited your good Offices
in regard to my Father, you had naturally
a Right, considering your Situation with
the Prince, to suppose that a Petition would
not be ^{again} presented against the Duke, the Princes

actually withdrawn the Prosecution against
my Father. All that I have to say on this
Subject is - that having at the Period alluded
to, drawn up a Paper, which my Father
signed, promising that nothing offensive to
the Duke, should ever again be inserted in
the Times while he was Proprietor, I have
used every possible exertion with my Father
that good Faith should be observed on the
present occasion. He certainly ought to
have exercised a sufficient Control over
my Father to prevent any further Columns
against the Duke. I have urged every Thing

I can say on the Subject, & having asked your
Assistance formerly on my Father's Behalf,
I am bound to assure you that I have not
been wanting in stirring numerous Petitions
against a Repetition of Abuse against his
V. Highness.
