Royal Highness's permission to convey to
Lord Minto, in reply to his Lordship's
letter of the 1st January, Your Royal
Highness's gracious approbation of the
measures he had adopted, in anticipation
of orders from hence, for the conquest

of the Islands of Mauritius & Bourbon.
