Lord North, I have signed the parcel of Warrants, this is certainly the proper time for granting the Pension of £3000. per annum to the Queen of Denmark you will therefore write to the Lord Lieutenant; I have this day signed the Warrant for appointing Mr. Hutchinson Provost of Dublin College.

Lord Dartmouth brought Mr. Hutchinson late Governor of Massachusetts Bay too late to be presented at my levee, but I desired he would introduce in my closet, as I was desirous of hearing his account how matters were when he left his Government, and am now well convinced they will soon submit; he owns the Boston Port Bill was the only wise and effectual method that could have been suggested for bringing them to a speedy submission, and that the Change in the Legislature will

be a means of establishing some Government in
that Province which till now has been a scene
of Anarchy; one of the Regiments arrived
the 1st of June the day he sailed, and the
People of Boston seemed much disappointed.
