My dear Sir

I called upon you this morning in consequence of having just heard from Lord Bathurst that it would be necessary to hold a Council for Affairs of Trade in a few days; and that after tomorrow it may be very difficult to collect six Members together (the number requisite for that purpose) for some time to come: and I meant to have requested you to take the earliest

before His Royal Highness The Prince  
Regent after His return to Town in order  
to know whether it might not be His  
Royal Highness's Pleasure to hold a  
Council either at York House or at the  
Treasury in the course of the day.

I understand from Lord Bathurst that  
the business would not take up many  
minutes.

If it should be His Royal Highness's  
Pleasure that a Council should be  
summoned for tomorrow, I will  
trouble you to acquaint me with His  
Royal Highness's Commands both upon  
that point, and the time and place

of its Meeting, in order that I may give  
the necessary directions without delay
