Excombe Sept 10. 1811

The Lord Chancellor, humbly takes leave to state to
Your Royal Highness The Prince Regent that
he waited upon Mr Percival for some hours
on Sunday last. They had much conversation
upon the Subjects, which Your Royal
Highness had the Goodness to mention on
Saturday. Their extreme Importance precludes
the possibility of coming to any Resolution
upon them in a first Conversation, if
their Nature did not necessarily render
them Matters for Cabinet Consideration,
upon which, therefore, Mr Percival & the
Chancellor could only converse generally
as Individuals. The Chancellor left
Mr Percival, understanding that he

meant humbly to propose to Your Royal
Highness to allow a Council to be held on
Tuesday the first of October with reference
to the Prorogation of Parliament, at
which, if it should be Your Royal Highness's
Pleasure to hold the Council, the Chan-
cellor will not fail to attend, and he
agreed with Mr Perceval that he would
remain in Town till the end of the week,
in the hope that the Cabinet, in general,
would also be in Town, in order to discuss
the Subjects, to which the Chancellor alludes.

The Lord Chancellor begs permission
to express his heartfelt & grateful Thanks
for the Consideration and Kindness, with
which Your Royal Highness was graciously
pleas'd to honor him at Windsor.
