My dear Sir

A circumstance has this day accidentally come
to my knowledge by the means of a Man of the Name of
Wilson a Taylor at Finchley, I employ him and I saw
him this Morning. - He has a Brother it seems in the
10th Dragoons His Royal Highness the Prince Regent's Regt.
N. Wilson was order'd to receive Two hundred Lashes
by the sentence of a Court Martial lately at Brighton,
by some great inattention (as I cannot impute it to
any other cause) the Man received two hundred &
Twenty Lashes. - I know the Brother has been at
Brighton about the Business, and has Evidence of
the Fact. - A Lieut Col. Palmer it appears super
intended the Punishment. -

I have no other Motive by this communication
to you than to prevent if possible unpleasant circum
stances being brought before the Public; and the more
especially so, from what lately pass'd on the subject
of Corporal Punishment before the House of Comman.

In my own opinion I think the Friends
of the Man may be inclined to drop

the Subject, by the Mans Discharge, and some com-
pensations from the Party whose Duty it was to
see, the Prisoner received no more Punishment
than the Court Martial awarded - The Case as
far as my humble judgement goes must in
being agitated, operate by prejudice of
the Service. - I am persuaded my friend
will at least give me credit for good
intentions in acquainting him with this cir-
cumstance; and will entirely act as his much
better opinion guides him.
