My Dear Sir,

I have drawn up a Memorial to the Prince Regent; and it is of much importance to the interests of the Haymarket Theatre that it should be submitted to His Royal Highness's consideration as speedily as possible.

My inability of attending, at present, with this Memorial, and of paying my personal duty, at Carlton House, is among the first of my mortifications which my restricted situation has rendered unavoidable.

Allow me to introduce to you, by this letter, my friend Mr. Winston; - he is my Partner, and Chieftain Aide-de-Camp; - and let me, further, intrude upon your goodness, by requesting you to point out to him when, and in what manner, he may have the Honour (if not contrary to etiquette) of presenting the Paper in question to the Prince Regent.
