Mr Percival presents his humble duty  
to your Royal Highness, and begs leave  
to acquaint your Royal Highness, that  
he has been given to understand that  
Doctor Reynolds, whose illness has prevented  
him from continuing his attendance on  
His Majesty, feels great inconvenience from  
not having received any payment for account  
of his attendance, and that his anxiety,  
on that account, is considered by his  
Friends as really aggravating the effects of  
his disorder. Mr Percival has therefore



ventured to draw a warrant to be paid  
per granary D. Reynolds 1500 on account of  
his remuneration for such attendance -  
It will be afterwards time enough, to come  
to some distinct arrangement respecting the  
amount of payment to be made

Mr Percival regrets that it would be  
attended with an inconvenience almost  
amounting to an impossibility to find funds  
at the present moment applicable to the  
payment of the other Physicians, who must  
as he apprehends be obliged to wait, till the  
pecuniary arrangements necessary upon the operation of the  
restrictions on the Treasury will open some fund  
for that purpose -
