Lord Wellesley presents his  
humble duty to Your Royal  
Highness, & requests permission to  
offer his grateful acknowledgements  
for Your Royal Highness's gracious  
condescension in forwarding Count  
Munster's letter by an express Messen-  
ger: The intelligence, which it contains,  
is most interesting, & (unless it can be  
supposed that Prussia is treacherous to  
herself) satisfactory; since it is certainly  
desirable



desirable, that more time should be given  
for the preparation of the Northern Powers  
against France.

Lord Wellesley will not fail to consider  
with serious attention the expediency of  
submitting, for Your Royal Highness's  
commands, a letter to the King of  
Prussia in the present crisis. He proposes  
to be in Town to-morrow, & to attend  
at York House on Thursday; before  
which time, he hopes to have access, by  
Count Munster's kindness, to the  
communications received from Vienna.
