Sir

I have this day received from some of the most
 respectable Merchants & Establishments of the Town of
 Liverpool a Petition which they have desired I will lay
 before his Royal Highness the Prince Regent for the reviewing
 or modifying the Ordinance in Council of the 26th April 1709
 as you before informed me that Mr. Alderman used me probably
 to say, I have of some time, & that the best method of
 laying similar Petitions before his Royal Highness with
 a view to their coming immediately under his Notice, would
 be to transmit them thro' you to be laid at his feet. I by
 leave to pursue the same method upon the present Occasion.
