Colonel Pembury presents His
Compliments to Colonel McMahon.

By Lord Liverpool's desire Colonel
Pembury sends herewith a Box con-
taining the Draft of a Letter from His
Royal Highness The Prince Regent to
The Bey of Algiers;— and if the
same should be approved by His
Royal Highness, it is hoped that His
Signature may be put to the Copy
upon Dullum either tonight or tomorrow
morning, as the Mediterranean Mail

must be closed tomorrow.

Lord Liverpool requests Colonel
Munro will submit to His Majesty
the necessity that is considered
to exist for the sending of such a letter
as is now offered for His Royal Highness's
approbation, in consequence of the dis-
satisfaction which has been expressed lately
by His Majesty at receiving an answer to the
letter which He addressed to His Majesty
last winter; and of the apprehension
which is entertained that His Majesty may
prohibit the exportation of Corn & other
Provisions for the Use of our Fleets &
Garrisons, and that He may open His
