The resolution, of a club of more than two hundred  
persons composed of Gentry, Clergymen, Farmers &  
Traders -

We are decidedly of opinion that we owe Duty and  
Allegiance to our most Excellent Sovereign Geo. 3<sup>d</sup>

And that we are bound to support His Royal  
Majesty the Prince of Wales as Prince Regent in the  
due exercise & right of the Royal Prerogative, as by  
Law & Custom, defined & established, on the inviolability  
of which, the Liberty of the People - the Safety of the British  
Constitution, so materially depend -

And that the Choice & Selection of the Executive  
Ministers, are a material branch of the Royal  
Prerogative, that cannot be encroached upon without danger

To the Constitution

We are of opinion, that the conduct, of Lord Grey & Grenville, has the appearance of attempting to encroach upon the Royal prerogative — & ought to be firmly resisted —

We are further of opinion — that no efficient administration can be formed with Lord Grey & Grenville —

“ If they are connected with others they will paralyse & derange the efforts of the Cabinet —

“ If left to themselves with the sole direction of Public affairs they will, judging from what they did when in office & their conduct since — in a few years subject their Country under the Spanish Yoke —

We are further of opinion, that the Marquis of Rockingham is the only man we know deserving the name of an

Excellente Statesman - capable of directing our Public  
affairs - to our happy issue - in this troubled period -

We conceive it, highly probable - that Lord Wellington  
would resign his Command - if Lord Grey & Grenville  
were at the head of the administration

We are further of opinion, that the efforts of Great Britain  
have been hitherto cramped & rendered - ineffectual - by the  
Lords of Opposition, particularly Lord Grey & Grenville

That the Army in the Peninsula - has not been sufficiently  
reinforced - that had Great Britain - appeared - in that  
Terrible & imposing attitude, that her resources & the energy  
of every of the British people - were capable -

it would long since - have forced the Energy of the Continent  
The houses would have fallen -

We are further of opinion - that if a small British Squadron  
had - since - appeared - at Constantinople - & threatened  
to stop the Supplies - the French Party there - would have been  
defeated - & Peace established - between Russia & the Turks

& further, that had a real Statesman - with great extended
