Sir

I consider it due to my own character, as a man of education and of honour, to lay before you the most positive assurances that the publications now advertised with my name appended, are works with which I have no concern whatever; and that my name has been used in them totally without my privity and consent; nor should I have known that such publications were issued to the world, had I not accidentally perused the advertisements in a newspaper of the day. Nothing but my poverty prevents me from instantly inserting counter-advertisements, but I have taken every precaution to guard the public against the imposition.

I have further the honor to inform you, sir, that the kindness I have received in your ready notice of my former communication has produced a resolution on my mind, never to allow into my work any introduction of matter injurious to H.
