S. J. Heard has sent to me another Warrant for Lord Wellington to which the Signature of the Prince Regent is required. It ought to have been sent with the others. But he tells me that he waited in expectation that his Royal Highness would have given him orders for a general Dispensation with respect to Installation as was done in the case of all the Knights lately elected. But as no orders were given, he thought it right no longer to delay sending the Warrant which I now enclose. This Dispensation has been

always granted to Knights Companions when

I have taken this oppor-
tunity to mention in my other Letter a circum-
stance relating to myself as connected with the
noble Order. I thought it would give you
less trouble to have this written than to beg of
you to mention it to his Royal Highness.

I will only state to you for fear of any
mistakes - that the collars are sent to the
Chancellor by the Family of the deceased Knights -
& that the Georges appendant to the Ribband with
the embossed Garter which are presented to the
Sovereign at the Levée are sent to the Chancellor
from the Sovereign by a Page of his presence who
has his Fee upon the occasion. If I mistake not
there are ~~five~~ the Georges of five deceased Knights

I am still confined to the house in
consequence of a very severe indisposition:
I should otherwise have waited upon you,
& personally explained to you these matters.
