Sir

His Royal Highness The Prince Regent having
been pleased to signify to me about Two Years ago His
Pleasure that the House which I inhabit at the Entrance
of Queen Elizabeths Gate on the Castle Hill should, when
the Lease expired be purchased as an Appendage to Windsor
Castle; I conceive it to be my Duty to request that you
will have the goodness to submit to His Royal Highness
that the Lease of this House will expire at Lady day next
when I understand that the Proprietors will put it up to
Auction, altho no notice has been issued of such their
Intentions, I have mentioned the Subject to Colonel Taylor
who observed that under the present Circumstances and
adverting to the general State of His Majestys Purse
His Majestys Trustees would not be justified in
making this Purchase altho he conceived it would

be a material Object to the Crown in reference
to the Site of Windsor Castle,
