The particulars of the affair I allude to are as follows—The Lyceum Theatre opened with English Opera in July 1809 when the same performance last all Night was repeated every night for the season, the Lady in question came to the Private Box called the Princess, generally two or three times a week, for a survey I refer you to the Box Book which Spring can show you—she was always accompanied or met there by Lord Henry Foley Gerald who continued in familiar conversation with her during the Opera & neither of them paid the smallest attention to the performance or any thing but each other which was remarked by the actors as well as others on the Stage—
