The Lord Chancellor, offering his most humble Duty
to your Royal Highness The Prince Regent,
takes Leave, (after apologising, on account
of the extreme pressure of business, for presuming
to make this Communication in this form,
instead of personally waiting upon your
Royal Highness) to mention that it was
his Intention to have postponed humbly
taking your Royal Highness's pleasure upon
the Nomination of a Vice-Chancellor to the
Easter: but the unexampled weight of
business, which must be earlier disposed
of, has obliged him to alter that purpose.
He thinks it right to state that he had

entertained a wish that he might be permitted to mention the Name of Lord Rederdate, who had been Chancker of Ireland upon this occasion, but his Lordship declines giving that permission. The Chancker therefore begs Leave humbly to recommend to your Royal Highness the Name of Mr Atty General whose Anxiety to have this Schackin, as it is represented to the Lord Chancker, he thinks himself bound to attend to, considering the Claims incident to his present Situation.

The Chancker takes Leave to mention that the Cabinet have not yet formed their Report upon the papers lately transmitted to the Chan^r - but probably will do so on this day.
