offer up my Prayers of Gratitude to
Providence, that it has, in its Omnipotent
Bounty, blessed my Country, and myself
with such a General. You have sent
me among the Trophies of your univall'd
Lame, the Baton of a French Marshal.
I send you in return, that of England.
