My dear Mr. Mahon

My nephew left Town last night on his return to London
Wellington deeply impressed with a sense of obligation to the Prince Regent
for the kind intercession manifested by H. R. H. towards him. He informed
me there was a general belief of an intended brevet promotion on His Royal
Highness's birth day - At present he stands a single instance of an Officer bringing
Home dispatches from a Commander in Chief, recounting a great Victory, not
being exclusively promoted. - I will know the kindness, the liberality
and the Princely conduct of the Regent on all matters, and His Royal Highness's
proper feelings on Military subjects, and I have already had a proof
by your kind communication, of His Personal Favour to me on this question.
Only be assured my dear Mr. Mahon that if by His Gracious Command
Major Fremantle should be included in the next brevet, I shall consider
it as a personal obligation from His Royal Highness which I shall be
bound to express to the end of my life. believe me always my Dear Mr. Mahon
