My Lord

On the 13 of June last I had the honor to enclose to your lordship a statement of my claims for a seat in Parliament, accompanied with a letter addressed to your lordship requesting that after you should have perused it, you would do me the favour to lay it before his Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that the claim so made would be acknowledged and that I should procure the fulfillment of his Majesty's gracious promise to me I feel at no time the smallest doubt, nor do I now feel the least uneasiness: but as this claim I subjoined the suggestion of substituting one thing for another I am

sensible how far the favour I solicited  
is superior to the thing claim'd, I am able  
away that of my pretending to be honour'd  
with such a mark of his Royal Highness's  
indulgence. I must not be allowed to judge  
at the same time I feel it incumbent  
on me to acquaint your Serenity that  
so far as the favour asked is separate  
and distinct from the claim made:  
it is the first I have ever in the course  
of a long life shuted from the throne

That there has been no prohibition  
made to me on this subject has I wish  
given me some assurance; tho' at the  
same time there may be reasons which  
prevented your Serenity from acknowledging  
the receipt of my letter, and which
