My Lord,

I have this moment received
your Lordship's letter of the 5th of August,

Regent - As the pressure of
Parliamentary Business at the close
of the session is very considerable -

As that period was at a short
distance, and as the delay could
have no material effect upon
the question itself, I thought it
would answer every purpose,
if I placed your letters together
with others of importance, to be
laid before His Royal Highness
for His consideration, during the

in His Royal Highness's Name, or
by His Command to your Communication.
But I should mislead your Lordship
if I did not apprise you that
