When I was in London in Sept<sup>r</sup> 1811 - you were  
 pleased to Interest yourself on behalf of Mr. Wm. Cuffpidge  
 (tho' I now one of the detained prisoners during the short peace  
 of 1802) and you were also pleased to say you had his name  
 entered in the Admiralty Office on the list of the first partial  
 Exchanges that would take place between this Country & France,  
 so long a time having since elapsed without his Exchange being  
 effected & Mrs Cuffpidge's Mother being in a very delicate state  
 of health, she has come over from <sup>France</sup> to Endeavour to do all in her  
 power to obtain his liberation, she will hand you this letter  
 & from you know Humanity & benevolence what the world  
 speak so highly of. I have every reason to hope that if Mr Cuffpidge's  
 liberation can be effected thro' your means you will cheerfully  
 lend her your assistance
