The Memorial of Capt. John Suck

Humblly sheweth.

That your Memorialist had the honour of laying -
before your Royal Highness, a Memorial dated August 1812, setting
forth that your Memorialist, crossed the Atlantic, both in the years
1890 & 1891, to Halifax in Nova Scotia, in search of a Silver mine,
said to have been discovered by Baron de Lindar. The truth of which
was certified by the Hon^{ble} Colonel Hanger: That your Memorialist
was Honour^d with a letter of the 17th Sept: 1812, from M. General Turner, appre-
cising your Memorialist, that the memorial had been commanded
to be transmitted to the Secretary of State for the home department,
Lord Sidmouth, for his consideration; That on the 12th December your
Memorialist was Honour^d with a letter from His Lordship's Office,
setting forth that the memorial had been transmitted by the
Commande of your Royal Highness, to The Lords of His
Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, as coming more
properly under their cognizance. That in Feb: 1813 your Memori-
alist received a verbal communication from the Lords of His
Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, that the memorial was
referred -

referred to the Lords of the Treasury; and your Memorialist
further begs to state that on the 7 July last, Mr Harrison at
the Treasury Chambers, sent for, and informed your Memorialist
"that Lord Liverpool, and Mr Canivert, had expressed that
they considered the transaction of a private nature, and
therefore did not see that Government could take any notice
of it. Having no funds to answer the demand? since which
your Memorialist has wrote three several times to Mr Harrison
on the 9 & 30 August. as also on the 27 Sept. but has not
been favoured ^{with} a reply. Your Memorialist humbly intreats
your Royal Highness to take the same into your Royal
Highness's gracious consideration, and grant him such
remuneration as in your Royal Highness's may think his
services merit
