but I must feel proud & gratified that every thing

active exertion at this Crisis has left no measure for me
to suggest or you to adopt upon the subject - There is
so much consolation in the manifestation of friendship &
Regard, that I am quite prepared to meet the probable
failure of all our hopes & wishes in this Instance with
perfect Patience & firmness - The entire hinges at this moment
upon the caprice & wavering ellend of perhaps the most
inconstant Man that lives - He may resign in a week
