George Prince Regent. &c. &c.

The Humble petition of Celia Grace of Longma  
in The County of Galway

May it please your Royal Highness  
Petitioner Humbly Sheweth -

That She has a Brother now Volunter  
in The Service of his Britannick Majesty. in  
America Under the Governor of that Part of The Island  
called Montreal, who had some Business to Transact  
with Part of his family, who had been in America  
for some years Back, and that on his Landing  
from Ireland, Last Winter he found that Hostilities  
were Commenced between that Country and Great  
Britain, and that, upon having the Cause of his  
<sup>Country</sup> + nearest at Heart. he Immediately after Landing  
Joined the British Standard and for the

Handsome Manner he Behaved and  
for his Distinguished Loyalty and Manly  
Conduct. When the Governor of the Province  
was going Thorough, Montreal, going to the  
Upper Province. The said Volunter -

Charles Grace. after he waited on the  
Governor. and his Spirited and Manly Conduct  
was made known to him, The Governor  
Immediately granted him for The Manner he  
Behaved

And as Alward for his Distinguished bravery  
he Ordered that Volunteer Charles Grace should  
be placed in Resituation in the Commissariat  
Department at Montreal. which Situation

Volunteer Grace has ever since filled  
with Honor, to Himself and to the Name  
of a British Subject. and was Wounded in defence  
of his Country. and with Hopes that it may please  
your Royal Highness, to Cause Inquiry  
to be made after the good Conduct of said  
Volunteer. Grace. from his Superior Commanders

and when same may be made known  
to your Royal Highness full Satisfaction  
that you will be pleased to have Volunteer

Charles Grace. continued in his present  
Employment. or any other that you or your  
Royal Highness Government may think  
most Expedient, so soon as Hostilities will  
cease, between Great Britain and the  
United States of America -
