his leaving England, and to have had the honour to beg H. R. H. H's
acceptance of it as a specimen of the workmanship of that
brave & glorious Nation, as well as a slight token of our
devotion & gratitude to H. R. H. H's, whose gracious pardon
for this liberty I shall await with the greatest anxiety.

From the distress of the inhabitants of Moscow all
work was stopped for some time, which prevented our
receiving it till now and in my husband's absence
I humbly beg leave to present it to H. R. H. H's,
with every mark of Respect, Devotion, & Love
which I most sincerely feel, but have not
words to express.
