When I arriv'd in this Country in the year 1803 I took the liberty of presenting to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, by the intervention of Sir Thomas Fyrvhitt, a set of german Prints, representing the Chateau, Waterworks, and Park, named Wilhelmsruhe, belonging to His Electoral Highness my Master.

His Royal Highness was graciously pleas'd to accept them, and if these Prints have been thought worthy of being preserv'd, they are very likely now in Carlton House.

An Artist of this town having undertaken a piece of workmanship for me, which he can not finish properly, without having a sight of the beforementioned prints, importunes me to obtain it for him if possible.

Understanding that the permission to view any of the pictures or prints, which are at Carlton House, depends upon Your consent, I beg leave, Sir, to request, that, if the above-mentioned prints are to be found, I may be permitted to view
