Sir,

Amidst the universal
exultation of Europe, I beg leave to present you
with a patriotic effusion, written in six languages,
in honor of the victories of the Prussians over
the French last year, but at that time & since
not made very public. As the late overthrow of
Bonaparte's Armies elicits still warmer expres-
sions of enthusiasm, & inflames a Briton's, a
German's, a Spaniard's & a Prussian's heart, it
would be a very high favor conferred on me, if you
would introduce it to his Royal Highness the

Prince Regent, & among your acquaintance.
Its circulation on the Continent would be attended
at this happy period, with the best of consequen-
ces, being written in six languages.

May I solicit your indulgence to
excuse the liberty I have taken in addressing you
this letter; your well-known liberal ideas have
emboldened me;
