May it Please your Royal Highness

Early last Spring I humbly requested your Royal Highness graciously to command my Boy to be placed as a Clerk in one of the three offices of the Secretaries of State, at the same time I took the Liberty of observing to your Royal Highness that I provided you did not graciously order him to be appointed to one of the first vacancies which might occur, that he might remain for a very very long time unemployed; To this request my friend Col Mettrahon told me that he had mentioned the business to Mr Arbuthnot. Six months are now elapsed Sir, and the affair remains in statu quo, and undoubtedly may

remain for a great length of time longer, unless
your Royal Highness shall graciously interpose
I humbly intreat you Sir to reflect (Should I die
before he is placed in a situation to earn his
bread) what a wretched state he will be left in,
for I have nothing to leave him at my death.
That kind goodness which I have experienced
from your Royal Highness for so many years
and the thorough knowledge I have of your
private feelings I am persuaded will induce
your Royal Highness to consider his situa-
-ation and attend to my humble but ardent
solicitations.
