My dear Morris;

The contents of your letter of yesterday, are so flattering & so grateful to my feelings, that I have not a moment to acknowledge its receipt.

Business relative to my Regiment, & an engagement of Company from London to Brussels, the two following days, prevent my return to London, before Saturday; which, I left lament, as, in a matter, where the most complete fidelity, & cordial allegiance, must be joined, as well as power to render the services which are expected, require some time, for full deliberation, with myself — meantime, nothing shall transpire from me, till I have had the verbal conference with you, & wish, in case you again see the friendly person with whom you have convers'd, you will say from me —

That the remembrance of protection, & friendship, exerted towards me, some years past, on a trying occasion,

are, or ought to be, ever uppermost in my mind.

The kind Friend, with whom you have had the communication you have sent me, could not have chosen a person more acceptable than yourself, to convey it to me, & believe me dear Morris
