Sir,

I take the liberty to report through you to the Prince Regent that, in consequence of a communication from H. B. H. the Commander in Chief, I have given an order to the Regiments of Life Guards that a Squadron from each of 150 Men with a proper proportion of Officers & Non Com? Officers shall be immediately selected & held in readiness to join the Troops now on service in the Peninsula; - which I humbly hope His Royal Highness will be pleased to approve -

I beg the favour of you at the same time to lay before His Royal Highness the enclosed recommendation of Lt General Barton to a vacant Cornetcy in the 2^d Life Guards. - I have the honor to be, Sir,
