 If you think so, & your personal con-

 earnestly solicit you to carry her to
 either of these Places. There is no kind
 of business which you & I could not
 perfectly transact by letter. I would
 suggest the going down to Newport did
 I not know that the Hot winds are
 reckoned severe on the River. Still, take
 that into your calculation. Pray you.
