My dearest Brother

I hasten to congratulate you on the good news we have received from Naples, which must be doubly satisfactory to you as by your spirited conduct you have so much contributed to the success of the allied Armies. I trust we may look on the Italian Campaign as over. This will of course encourage the Troops on the Rhine, all unite in saying that the Austrian Army was never so far as at this moment. The Emperor of Austria took up his Head Quarters at Heilbronn last night, he dined here with the Emperor on his road, and desired me to present his

Compliments to you and express how much
he regretted that business had prevented
his making you a visit last Year. I
like his appearance very much, his Majesty
is beloved by his Subjects and enjoys a
very good private Character, besides which
he is friendly and open in his manners.

The Empress is a charming pleasant
woman and pretty though in a bad
state of health.

I hope my dear Brother that your health
has not suffered this Spring from the
anxiety you have gone through. - I am
too sincerely attached to you not to be
anxious about Charlotte and am
