My dear Liverpool

Although it is extremely inconvenient to me to write in my present state, I can not suffer the day to pass without sending you an answer to the letter which I received this morning. — I can make no objection to your proposal respecting Mr. Canning, but in reference to your letter, wherein you state that you have only made a partial communication of that intention to your colleagues: I must therefore both hope & trust, that you are satisfied that his introduction to the Cabinet, however personally desirable, will not be productive

of division, or any want of harmony in a
Government, with which I am so perfectly
contented & with which I & the Country have
so much reason to be well satisfied: You
can not more sincerely regret than I do, the
Loss we have all of us sustained in our
poor friend Lord Buckingham here, always
