Lord Liverpool has the Honour to send
Your Royal Highness the Minutes of the
House of Lords of last night, together with
copies of Address voted, and of Amendments
proposed by Lord Grenville, and rejected.

Lord Liverpool has the Satisfaction of
informing Your Royal Highness, that
the Impropriety of the Debate appeared
to be very favourable as to the course of
Policy adopted by Your Royal Highness
Government, the more so as Lord
Grenville's Speech, was an Attack upon
the large Militia Establishment of the
Country, and he Objected to the Army-
-ment by which Thirty thousand
British

British Troops were to be kept in Peace,
as inconsistent with the former Policy
of the Country, and dangerous to the Constitution

And therefore has been kept
concerned to hear that your Royal
Highness has had some Return of the
Gent, He requests your Royal Highness
will be so good as to direct any of the
Gentlemen in Attendance upon your
Royal Highness, to write him or him
to inform him of the State of your
Royal Highness's Health
