My dear Sir

After I despatched my letter of yesterday
I received one from General Taylor, returning the printed
Treaty of Marriage which I had transmitted to him.
I perceive by the 5th Article that of the Princess should
"die without issue, one half of the Kingdom shall
"devolve with the Head of the House of Brunswick & the
"other half shall be at Her Majesty's disposal & for the late
"Queen has vested Her Majesty, ultimately in the present King
"of Great Britain & the House of Brunswick, it probably may
"occur to Her Royal Highness to direct Regent that
"it may be proper to leave the Kingdom occasioned by
"the death of the Queen & Regent to be filled by the
"consent of the King of Brunswick, & that this
"Royal Highness stand more on of this provision
"in relation to General Taylor, to give the Kingdom
"occasioned by the death of the Queen & Regent to be filled

And having this Settlement before me, now I had
addressed You, I was not aware of the Interest which
is now become vested in the King & Courtiers.

It is the Royal Pleasure with necessary pleasure
to express her pleasure of the Courtiers by the
in a Baron Comptroller, the Comptroller may be pursued
for the King to complete the transfers -

The difficulty occasioned by the late King having
