The Dispatches received from the Continent contain nothing particular. I enclose the King of Prussia's letter of Condolence; a Dispatch from Hardenberg and finally a letter from the Duke of Cambridge who wishes that some step should be taken respecting <sup>his marriage by</sup> your Royal Highness. Perhaps a private letter to the Father of the Prince might answer the purpose?

The Duke of Clarence will have informed your Royal Highness of my having obeyed your Commands and of his intending to come to Brighton without delay.
