Walmesley the Recluses - Men would the Winter
have proved an hindrance to a more
extensive distribution, had I not considered
it most prudent to wait until the next
Summer, that Men from frequent use,
should become confirmed by individual experiments
of their certain security; should any accidents
happen to their Boats - which the severity
of the weather has hitherto precluded -
permitting them to form their judgements
only from the experiments they witnessed

further countenance of Your Royal Highness
