I have not failed to lay before the
Prince Regent, and by his Command, before
the Duke of Clarence; your Lordship's letter,
with the Particulars of the Provision to be
made for the Duke of Clarence, in contempla-
-tion of his Royal Highness's Marriage:
and although his Royal Highness the Duke
of Clarence had confidently looked to a
Town Residence being included in that
Provision, still his Royal Highness, unwilling

to have the appearance of encroaching upon
 the liberality of your Lordship & of the
 Government; and the Prince Regent
 having been pleased to continue the
 accommodation which the Duke enjoys
 in St. James's Palace: His Royal Highness

 Lordship's Proposal: The Prince Regent

 Lordship His full approbation of the
