H. the Prince Regent whose gracious Confidence, I at one time so proudly partook, alas now for ever bereft, by machination, I so unjustly deserve continued it is in your Power, to ameliorate my Sufferings, much more so when turning back to our former Intimacy, and Friendships, I feel still, nor can I convince myself other wise, by not receiving an answer must be the Cause of the miscarrying your Perusal, by the inclosed from His Royal Highness the Prince August of Prussia, you will see Sir that my aim is every where, were moneys is justly due — my present occupation is directed to the publishing of my Extrem and unjust hardships I experienced at Portugal, in comparison with my former Connexion, and Confidence I was intrusted, and to shew the world how vain our Dependence is when resting on promises — in Expectation of your kind answer on my request I again sign myself in full gratitude
