Sir,

In obedience to your Royal Highness's commands I humbly submit to your consideration & expediency of directing that if subscriptions which your Royal Highness may please to give to Mr Bellamy, be paid to him; & that Mr Bellamy be informed that if subscription is so paid to him because it is probable that he may have incurred extraordinary expenses in expectation of it: And further, that it is your Royal Highness's pleasure that Mr Bellamy desist from sending any more numbers of his work to Carlton House.

Your Royal Highness commanded me to state in a few words, reasons upon which my opinion is founded. They are six, that Mr Bellamy in his new translation of the Bible from the Hebrew text, has taken great & unwarranted liberties with an accredited translation; & that Mr Bellamy presumes much on your Royal Highness's protection.
